

Committees in Calgary, Edmonton, Ottawa, and Sarnia host special events celebrating Canadian women, 'Persons' Day, and the Enbridge Famous 5 Speaker Series. The Calgary committee, in partnership with Carya (formerly Calgary Family Services), teaches the attendees of Young Women of Power (YWOP) about the attributes and the accomplishment of the Famous 5.

Enbridge also sponsors two youth award categories: History and Leadership.
